Newest Daedalus Member John Corbett

In December 2010, John Corbett became the newest member of the YSS Giving Society at the Daedalus level. The total number of members of the YSS Daedalus/Icarus Society is 508. The full listing of the membership is on the last few pages of this newsletter. Thanks to all of our generous Daedalus/Icarus members for sharing our commitment to help the next generation solve problems, grow, and become self-sufficient, responsible, and contributing members of society.

John's gift of \$100,000 came at a time of great need for YSS. The flat portion of the roof on Youth Recovery House (YRH) had been covered with ice the previous year and was damaged by water. John's gift allowed YSS to restructure the roof to improve drainage and prevent ice and water damage. The ceiling was raised in the classroom/group/dining room, and the shingles were replaced. The living room was redecorated so that the Victorian home located at 804 Kellogg in Ames would be more welcoming and homelike for the boys living there while they complete chemical dependency treatment.

In January, John participated in lunch with the YRH

residents and listened to their recovery struggles and successes. The boys presented John with thank you cards and a tour of their facility. John was able to see the reconstruction of the former garage firsthand and the change in the roof to prevent water damage. To honor John, the remodeled classroom/group/dining room has been named The Corbett Room.



John is a Distinguished Professor of Liberal Arts and Sciences and a former chair of the Chemistry Department at Iowa State University. He was able to gift the maximum amount, \$100,000, of his required minimum distribution from his retirement IRA, to YSS without incurring a tax liability himself. The

check was sent to YSS directly from his retirement fund.

With the help of the community and donors like John, YSS is able to provide vital services to youth and families of central Iowa. Thank you, John, for asking if YSS had a need and responding in a very generous way.

Endow Iowa Update

When completing your end-of-year charitable giving, don't forget about the opportunity to receive a state of Iowa tax credit of 25% of any donations to YSS through Endow Iowa. In addition, you get the regular federal charitable gift deduction. Here's how it works:

Cash gift to Endow Iowa	\$1,000	\$10,000	\$100,000
Less tax benefits			
Federal charitable deduction assuming maximum tax bracket	- \$350	- \$3,500	- \$35,000
Endow Iowa Tax Credit	- \$250	- \$2,500	- \$25,000
Net cost of contribution	\$400	\$4,000	\$40,000

Some things to remember:

- Tax credits of 25% of the gifted amount are limited to \$100,000 per person per year, \$200,000 per couple if both are Iowa taxpayers and have separate IRAs.
- Eligible gifts will qualify for credits on a first-come/first-served basis until the yearly appropriated limit is reached. In May 2011, Governor Branstad increased the yearly appropriated limit by \$800,000 to \$4.5 million per year. If all of this has been used, qualified donors will be eligible for the next year's Endow Iowa Tax Credits. You are encouraged to act early to ensure you receive your state tax credit.
- You have five years to use your Endow Iowa tax credits.

Agencywide, 3,067 donors made 3,680 *Friends* gifts totaling \$697,365. Of this number, 1,288 donors made 1,431 gifts through Reggie's Sleepout.

Barrs Establish Endowment Fund For YSS of Marshall County

In December of 2010, while doing their end-of-the-year financial planning, Paul and Carrie Barr established a permanent Endow Iowa Barr Fund through the Marshall County Community Foundation. They placed their gift of \$10,000 into this endowed fund so that only the interest will be taken each year and the principal will remain to generate funds forever to help a young person get back on track. The Endow Iowa program provides the Barrs with a credit on their Iowa taxes of 25% of the \$10,000, or \$2,500. And they have five years to use the credit if they don't need it all the first year. In addition, the entire \$10,000 is a charitable tax deduction on their federal taxes.

Paul and Carrie wish to impact young people for the better. They chose YSS of Marshall County because they believe that YSS of Marshall County offers a helping hand to troubled young people who are trying to make a better future for themselves and their families. They welcome others to donate to the Barr Fund and help youth. This is a win-win situation for both the donor and the youth of Marshall County. 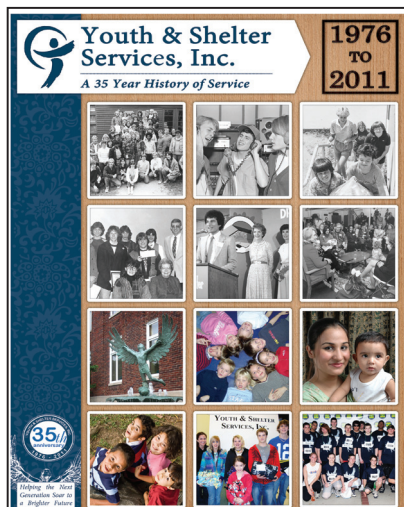
Rollover IRA Helps YSS And The Horners

In December 2010, Congress extended the IRA Charitable Rollover through December 31, 2011. Donors aged 70½ and older are eligible to move up to \$100,000 from their IRAs directly to qualified charities without having to pay income taxes on the money. Unless Congress extends this benefit, it will expire December 31, 2011.

YSS received a generous Rollover IRA from Jack and Cecilia Horner at the end of 2010. This was their largest annual *Friends* gift and represented their belief in the mission of YSS to help youth become self-sufficient, responsible, contributing members of society.

Their IRA agent took care of sending the check, as the law requires that the check come from the IRA agent and not the donor. Cecilia and Jack came in to meet George and shared that they never had to use the services of YSS for their children, but that they were comforted that services were available if they did need them. And they wanted to do their part to insure services for youth of Ames both now and in the future. Jack is an ISU University Professor in the Genetics, Development, and Cell Biology Department and Cecilia is an English teacher retired from Ames High School. After visiting with George at YSS, Cecilia volunteered to proofread the new 88-page 35th anniversary history of YSS, a time-consuming task. YSS is grateful to the Horners, both for the gift of their IRA rollover and especially for their time and belief in the youth mission of YSS.

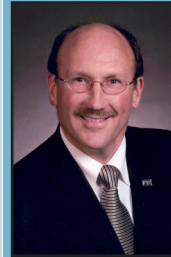

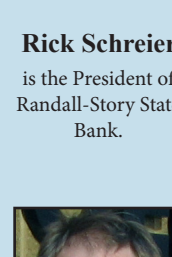

What Will Happen To YSS When Our Founder, George Belitsos, Retires?

This is an important question and one for which donors deserve an answer. YSS Boards, too, realize that the work of YSS is very important and must move forward after George retires. In addition, in 2009, YSS was accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), and one of the requirements for accreditation was that YSS have a succession plan.

In 2007, the Boards of Directors of Youth and Shelter Services, Inc., and Youth and Shelter Services Foundation, Inc., were presented with a succession plan by the CEO (George Belitsos) and the Management Team staff. This plan was originally completed in November 2007, and is updated annually. YSS retained Russell Jensen of Jensen Consulting to assist in developing a succession plan for the CEO and for key management positions throughout the organization.

Don Broshar has facilitated several Management Team retreats to discuss transitions and the succession plan. In developing the plan, Mr. Jensen met multiple times with representatives of both Boards, the CEO, and senior management staff. He also met individually with the CEO and the Associate CEO to facilitate the process.

Results of this work include:

- An emergency CEO succession plan outlining how the Board and organization will handle an unexpected loss of the CEO.
- A planned CEO succession plan outlining how the organization will develop potential successors, and how the Board will select a successor.
- Departmental succession plans identifying potential successors for key management positions throughout the organization, development plans for those potential successors, and a process for selecting successors.
- The Management Team is able to update and administer the plan going forward.

YSS succession plans and related documents are reviewed and updated annually by the Management Team, and reviewed and approved annually by the YSS Board and the YSS Foundation Board. The annual review of the plan takes place in the fall of each year.
